### Subject: “ Awarding RO Authorization Status and Delegation for the Performance of Statutory Surveys and Certification to Overseas Marine Certification Services (OMCS CLASS)”

Ref. : “Agreement governing the delegation of Statutory Certification Services for vessels registered in the Guinea-Bissau Ships Registry, between the Guinea-Bissau Maritime Administration & Overseas Marine Certification Services (OMCS CLASS).

1. As per the recently signed agreement and effective 06<sup>th</sup> May 2022, the Guinea-Bissau International Ships Registry is pleased to announce the conclusion of the agreement for the Performance of **Statutory Surveys and Certification to “Overseas Marine Certification Services”** (Panama City, Panama). According to the Agreement, Overseas Marine Certification Services is fully authorized to perform statutory survey services leading to the issue of pertinent certification. Statutory certification and services comprise the assessment of Guinea-Bissau registered ships and/or ship management companies in order to determine the compliance of such ships/companies with the applicable requirements of the international conventions, codes, and national legislation and the issuance of, or in support of the issuance of, relevant certificates and documents.

2. The authorization awarded to Overseas Marine Certification Services, for attaining RO authorization status and delegation for the performance of Statutory Surveys and certification on behalf of the Guinea Bissau International Ships Registry (G-B I.S.R.), is based on policy priorities reflected within the “Code of Operation of the International Ships Registry of the Republic of Guinea-Bissau” focusing upon a strategic approach for the G-B I.S.R., in meeting its responsibilities in recognizing, authorizing and monitoring its recognized organizations, and also on the full spectrum of IMO RO Code requirements. The G-B I.S.R. is committed to realizing high standards for safety, pollution prevention, and operational aspects of ships, in accordance with its standing operational priorities and business practice model.

3. The above authorization is accordingly reported within the IMO GISIS Module “Recognized Organizations”, in line with IMO Member States' submission of information, as prescribed by MSC/Circ.1010-MEPC/Circ.382.
